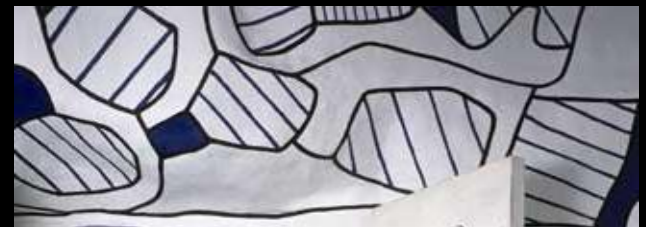

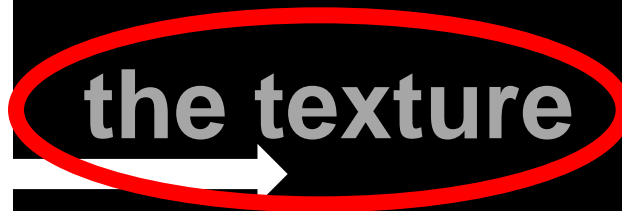



A texture can be **VISUAL**.

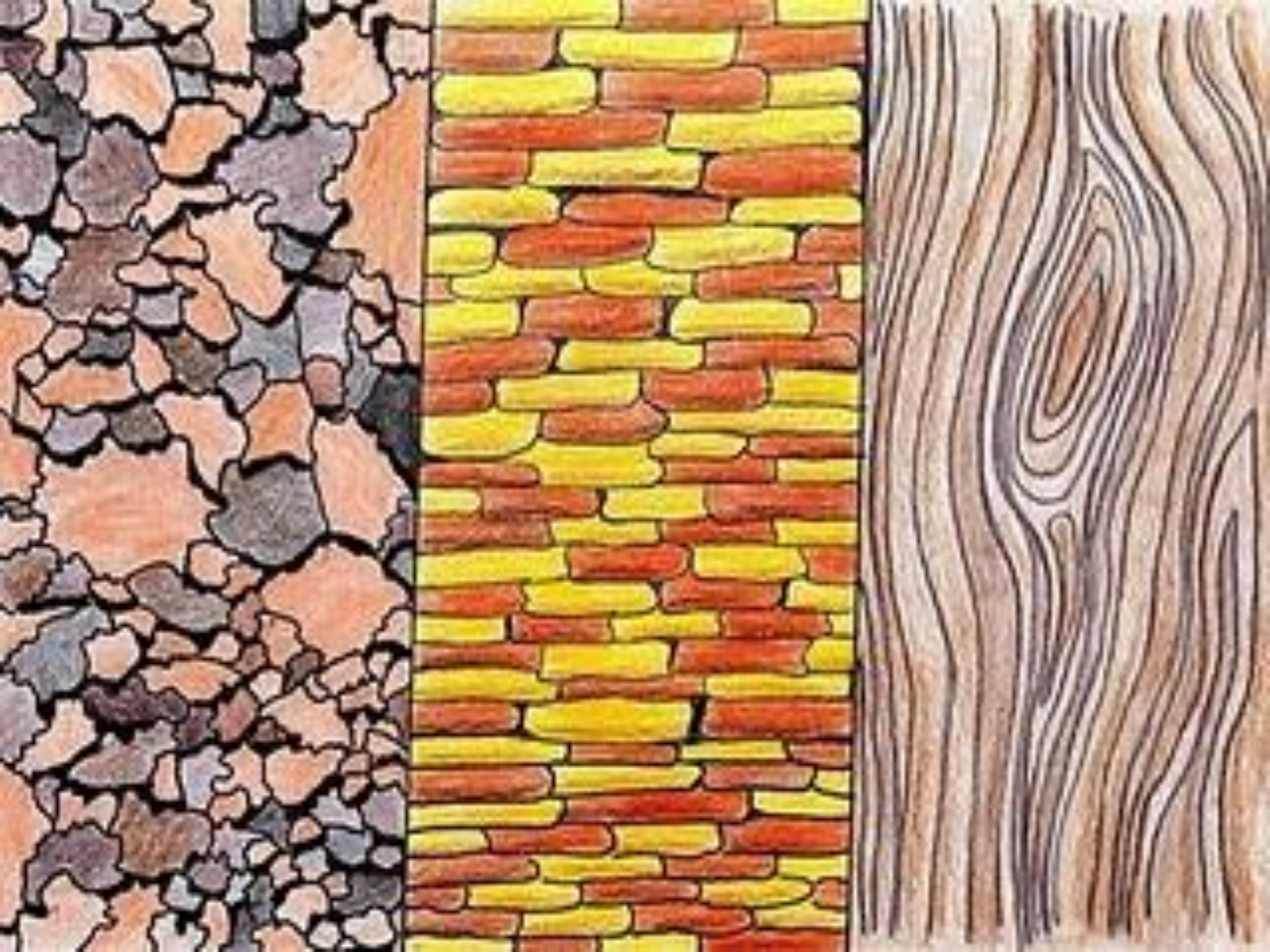
And a texture can also be tactile.

textures



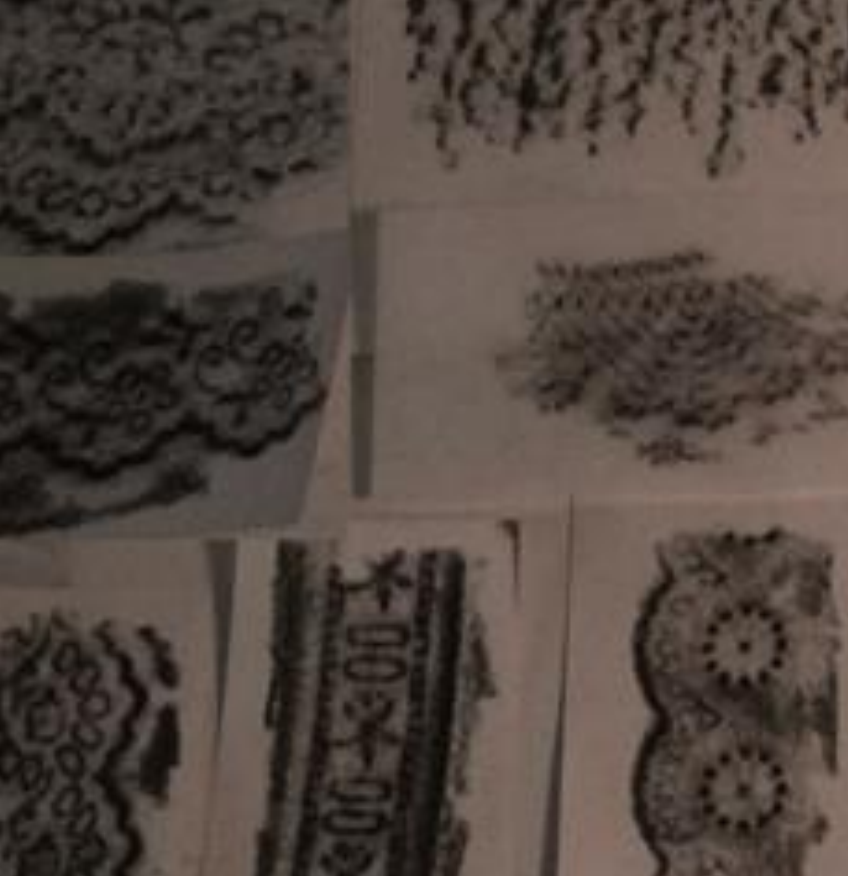




We can **rub** textures

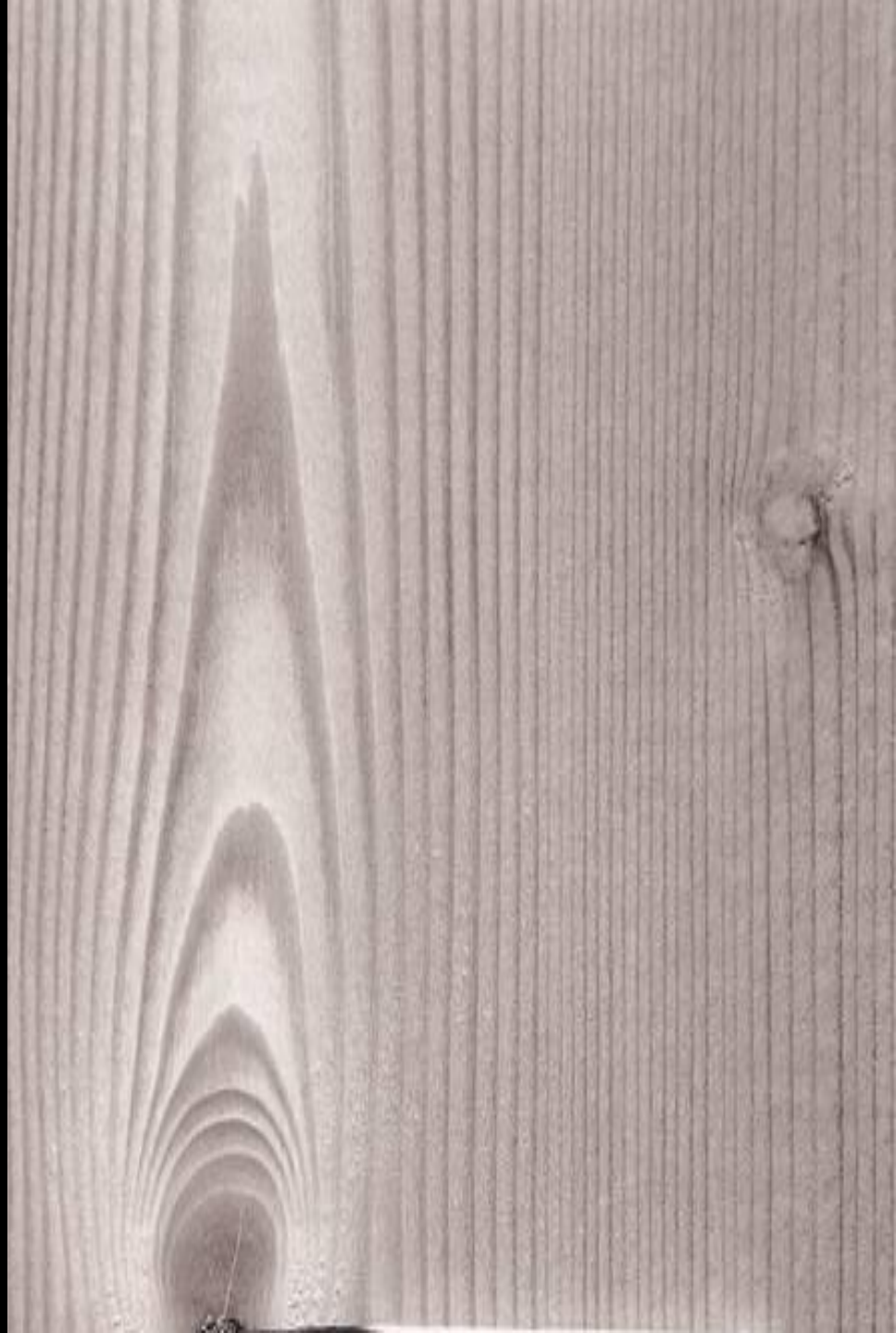

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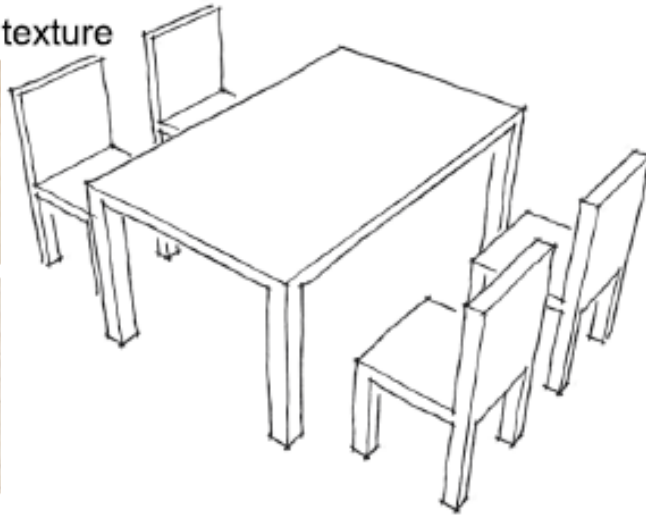

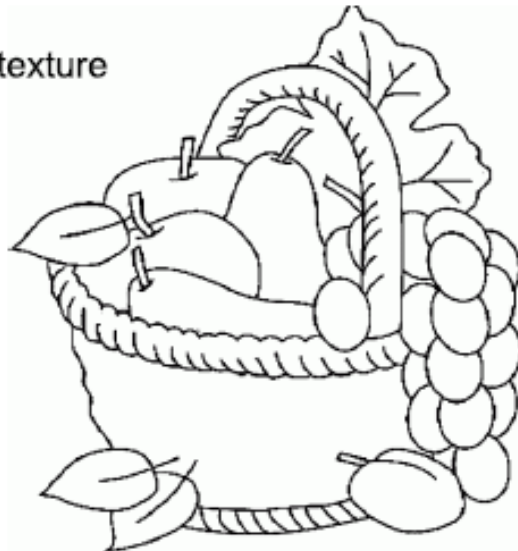


Drawn textures
